Giving Strategy

ONE Gas is dedicated to giving back to the communities we serve through financial contributions and volunteer efforts to create a better tomorrow. That commitment is reflected in charitable grants, employee matching grants, support for public schools, volunteer initiatives and participation in local United Way campaigns.



Foundation Grants

The ONE Gas Foundation supports our communities with charitable grants in the following three focus areas:



Community
Enrichment &
Assistance

This includes natural gas safety, equipment, disaster recovery and investing in public spaces. These align with our mission and Core Values while championing the use of natural gas.



Education & Workforce Development

Our focus is on Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics (STEAM). This approach aligns our efforts to equip the next generation's workforce with the necessary skills.



We seek to leverage our resources with other organizations, allowing us to create a greater impact and better quality of life. This approach helps address the cultural needs of the communities we serve.

In 2024, as part of ONE Gas' 10-year anniversary,

we created a special way to give back to the communities we serve. Our employees nominated nonprofits in Kansas, Oklahoma and Texas to receive a grant from the ONE Gas Foundation. After hundreds of our co-workers voted, one nonprofit in each state was selected to receive a \$10,000 grant — keep reading to learn more about each of the organizations that received an anniversary grant.

Employee Giving and Matching Grants

The ONE Gas Foundation allows our employees and retirees to further their impact to the nonprofits they support by providing a dollar-for-dollar match to eligible 501(c)(3) nonprofit organizations within our service area and higher education institutions. The program matches up to \$5,000 per employee and \$1,000 per retiree each year.

Public School Funding

Our Public School Funding program aims to enhance the 5-12 classroom experience to prepare the students of today for the workforce of tomorrow. These grants fund STEAM-related classroom initiatives focusing on enrichment projects and instructional technology, as well as curriculum-based teaching materials and equipment. We find projects through a partnership with education nonprofit DonorsChoose, where teachers can request public support for classroom projects by posting grant applications.

ONE Gas Anniversary Grant Recipient

North Central Kansas CASA and Hope's Place Child Advocacy Center

The ONE Gas Foundation awarded a \$10,000 anniversary grant to North Central Kansas Court Appointed Special Advocates (NCK CASA) and Hope's Place Child Advocacy Center (CAC). The nonprofit represents the best interest of abused and neglected children in the courts, providing volunteer representation for children and a safe, permanent and nurturing home.





"This amazing gift gives us further resources to find qualified, caring community members to serve as a voice for abused and neglected children in the court system," said Tony Miller, Executive Director of NCK CASA and Hope's Place CAC. "This donation will help us to recruit and train volunteers and host an appreciation event."



Foundation Grant Highlight

We also supported the Kansas Children's Discovery Center with a grant to help fund their new high-efficiency natural gas heating equipment as part of an expansion project. The Kansas Children's Discovery Center is a hands-on children's museum where guests can explore, create, discover and learn through play. The museum recently welcomed 120,000 annual visitors.

Public School Funding | Supporting Science in Action

In Ottawa, Kansas, we funded a project to purchase lab equipment to help students complete hands-on science experiments.

ONE Gas Anniversary Grant Recipent

Family Shelter of Southern Oklahoma

Family Shelter of Southern Oklahoma was selected to receive the ONE Gas Foundation's \$10,000 anniversary grant in Oklahoma. The shelter provides safety, relief and support for people who have suffered physical and emotional abuse as a result of family violence, sexual assault and stalking.

"We will use the donation to provide clients their basic needs while in the shelter, such as food and hygiene supplies, as well as those unexpected client needs such as certain work attire and housing application fees," said Kathy Manning, Executive Director.



Foundation Grant Highlight

American Association of Blacks in Energy

The Oklahoma chapter of the American Association of Blacks in Energy (AABE) promotes

the academic and professional success of African Americans through educational initiatives, mentorship and advocacy for diversity in STEM fields. After becoming inactive in recent years, ONE Gas employees began working to revive the chapter.

To support students and honor our dedication to AABE, the ONE Gas Foundation provides funding for three \$3,000 scholarships each year. Administered by AABE, these scholarships are awarded to high school seniors interested in energy careers.

Public School Funding | Building a Love for Careers in Construction

In Woodward, Oklahoma, the ONE Gas Foundation supported a project to purchase equipment that will help encourage career exploration and a love for construction, carpentry and woodworking.

The natural gas-powered flame will be lit 365 days a year to serve as a lasting tribute to those who died and provide a warm, comforting space for visitors of the Healing Garden.
